SAVE TIME AND MONEY

Boat owners use their boats an average of 15 times annually (NMMA). Therefore, based on the monthly expenses listed above, it will cost the average boat owner approximately \$408 per use. In order to properly maintain a boat in clean and safe operating conditions, between one to two hours per outing should be spent on covering/uncovering, cleaning, and maintenance. Additionally, a boat should be serviced every season by a qualified service technician. Boat owners who have to trailer their boat will spend 2½ to 3 hours per outing preparing the boat, launching, loading, and stowing the boat.
